Informing Literacy Practice (i-Lit)

i-Lit is a professional learning opportunity for primary year's educators, which aims to improve literacy outcomes for all students and to develop quality literacy pedagogies. Educators will work intensively with consultant Carmel Small over three sessions. These sessions will address the collection and use of classroom data as well as learning how to identify a literacy teaching focus. Participants will plan for explicit teaching linked to the literacy demands of persuasive texts as defined by the Australian Curriculum. Data collection will involve the benchmarking of writing and the benchmarking of reading. Data instruments include, running records, (including MSV analysis and comprehension assessment), fluency and phrasing – a one minute read, use of writing success criteria aligned to different types of text and various early years assessments when needed (including concepts of print & SPA).

What are the expected outcomes?

- Improved student outcomes in literacy with a focus on quality pedagogy
- Enhanced use of data to inform practice related to the reading and writing of persuasive texts
- Development of a range of explicit literacy teaching strategies
- Involvement in a professional learning community

What will the professional development involve?

How to plan, program and assess literacy learning around a particular focus, collecting data against set criteria and the analysis of evidence to inform practice. This will include:

- Analysis of writing samples using writing criteria (generated by Nelson Cengage and aligned with Australian Curriculum standards)
- Revisiting the conventions of a running record
- Practice at undertaking a running record together, then independently
- MSV analysis
- The components of the whole reading record, including the retelling and comprehension aspects

How much will it cost?

\$295 (including GST) per participant, to attend all three after school sessions.

Do participants need to attend all sessions?

It is mandatory that participants attend **all three sessions** in order to assess and analyse the literacy evidence collected from students over a period of time. <u>Participants will also be expected to undertake data collection and the teaching of identified strategies in between each session</u>. **Teams of staff** from participating schools are encouraged to attend.
