The country mouse was happy in his small, brown house until his cousin, the town mouse, came to visit.

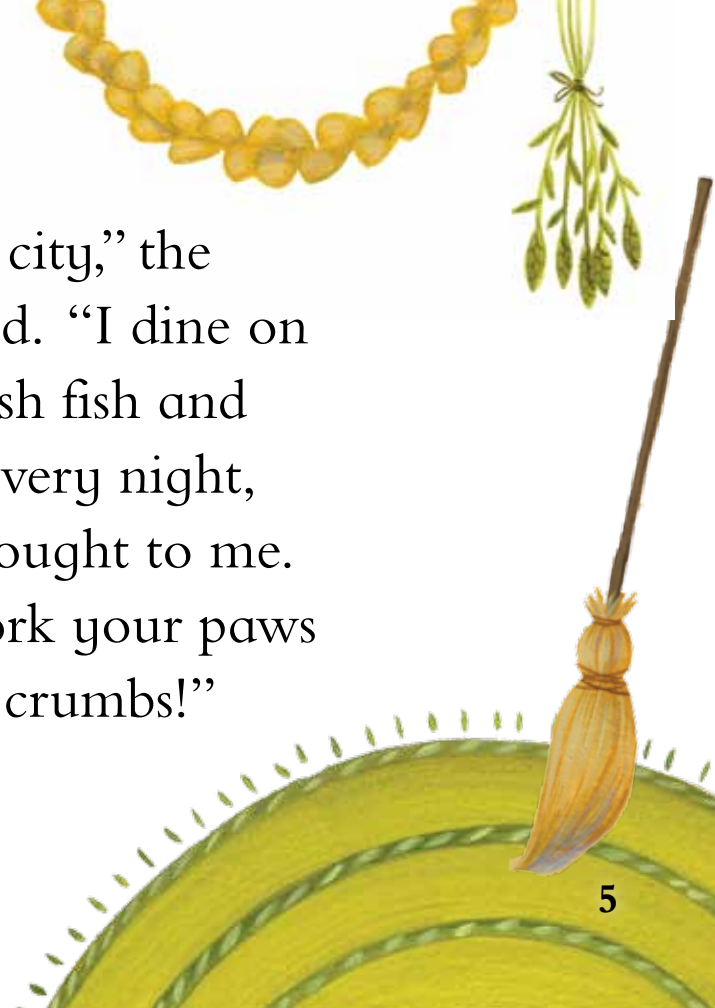

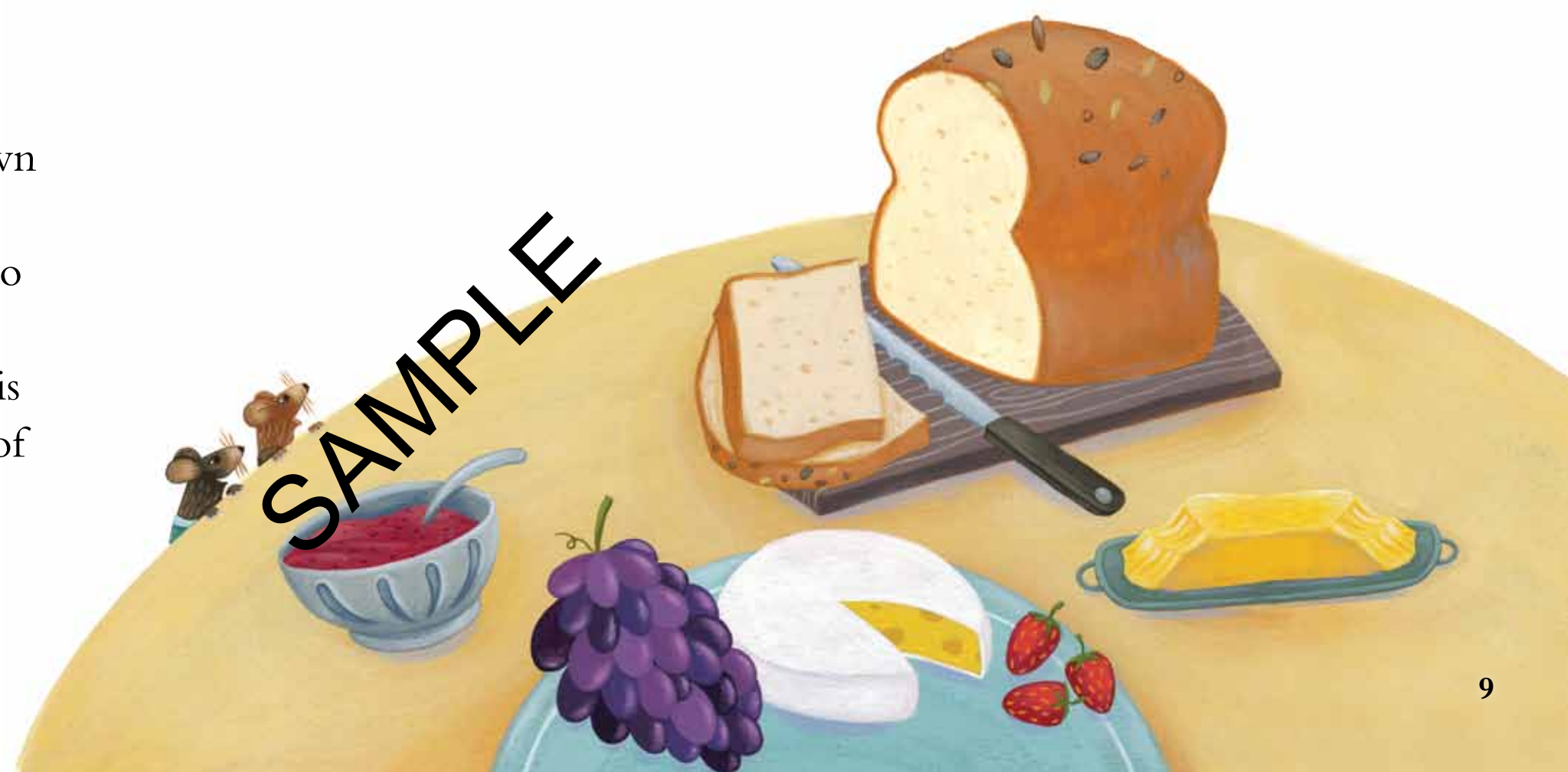
When the country mouse heard this, he looked around his small, brown house and thought, *I am so tired of hunting and scraping for food. Why should I have to work so hard?*
